Cathedral Schools Trust - Academy Conversion

Following the consultation period (comments and questions are available via the school website), governors unanimously agreed to move forward to the next stage in the process to join CST Multi-Academy Trust, with the aim to complete by August 2017. We are currently in formal consultation with staff on employment transfer issues and completing the due diligence procedures to ensure there are no financial or legal problems.

School Meals - Summer Menu

When the weather is fine during the summer months, we allow children with packed lunches to eat outside, which many of them really enjoy. In order to enable children who have school meals the same privilege, we are changing the menu slightly for the last 5 weeks of term (starting Mon 19th June) so that instead of the jacket potato option, there will be baguettes (with the same choice of fillings) and where possible, some of the main options will be served in take away boxes so the children can take it outside.
