Writers' Tea Party

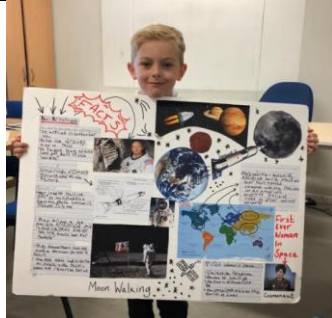

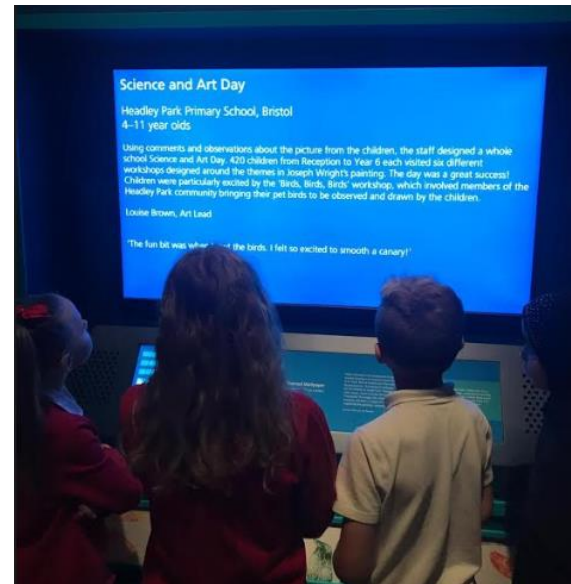
Headley Park Artists Exhibited at the National Gallery, London

It's on at the National Gallery until 11th August - it's a great exhibition and Headley Park is featured quite prominently, with both the paper mache birds and the video of our



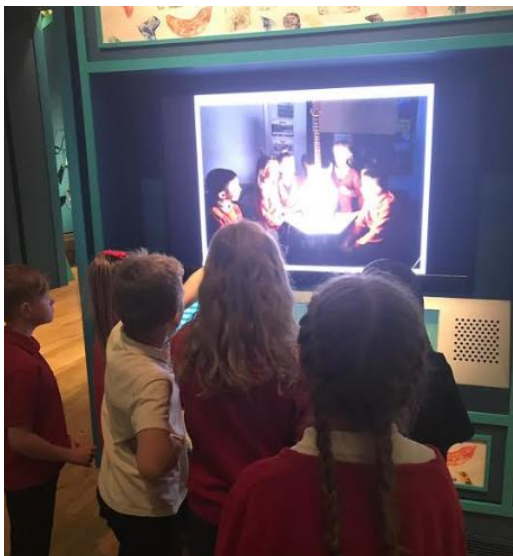
Art and Science Day. Entry is free so please do take your children to see it if you have the chance. I am sure it will make them very proud!

Online Safety

A Guide to TikTok

Previously known as Music.ly, TikTok is a popular app with young children and teens that enables children to watch music clips and create short clips of up to 60 seconds to share online with followers. Although it has a minimum age limit of 13, the app is extremely popular among children below this target age group and, as such, runs the risk of containing inappropriate content for those slightly younger ones who may be accessing it. The makers of TikTok have recently engaged with online safety charity, [Internet Matters](#), to promote the digital well-being of its users and ensure their safety online when using the app. [Here](#) is a quick guide for parents to ensure that your child is using it safely.
