| Who is the guidance for? | This is for individual pupils who are unable to attend school due to a positive covid test or those required to stay at home by NHS Test and Trace. Please note, children who are particularly unwell with covid-19 will not be expected to complete the remote learning. | | | | |
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| How will learning be structured and what will it include? | As the teacher will still be teaching the rest of the class in school, pupils who are required to complete remote education will receive a weekly timetable. This will mirror the subjects covered in school as closely as possible. The timetable will provide some suggested timings, appropriate to the age of the child. (KS1- 3hrs, KS2- 4hrs) A daily overview will also be uploaded to SeeSaw. This will include a daily reading, writing and maths session and at least one other subject. | | | | |
| | Headley Park seek to provide families with as much flexibility as possible. As a result, the overview will provide the option of a live lesson (via Google Meet) and/or a pre-recorded lesson. In both instances, follow up tasks will be provided. Completed tasks should be uploaded to SeeSaw or Tapestry. | | | | |

| How will children access the learning? | On the first day of absence, parents/carers should inform the school office. The office team will ascertain whether the child is well enough to complete the remote learning and if so, they will advise parents that on this first day of absence only they should concentrate on practising the spelling, reading and times tables outlined in the child's homework. | | | | |
| | On day two and beyond, class teachers will make contact with the family by phone or SeeSaw. Remote learning will begin. | | | | |
| How will teachers keep in touch with pupils? | As this is likely to be a 10-14 day absence, teachers will check in with pupils at least once per week by phone or SeeSaw. If a child | | | | |
