

Phonics Glossary

Common language used in phonics at Headley Park

Phoneme The smallest unit of sound in a word - often referred to as a sound.	Grapheme A letter or sequence of letters that represent a phoneme (The written form of a sound.)	GPC (Grapheme-phoneme correspondence) The match between a phoneme and grapheme.
Digraph A phoneme that is represented by two letters. (Two letters make one sound)	Trigraph A phoneme that is represented by three letters.	Vowel digraph Vowel digraphs are two vowels that when placed together generate one sound.
Adjacent consonants Consonants blended together when reading a word.	Split vowel digraphs A digraph that is separated by one or more consonants within a word. E.g, make.	Alternate graphemes Different representations of a phoneme in a word.
Polysyllabic word A word with more than one syllable.	Blending Say individual phonemes, put together to make a word.	Oral blending Say phonemes in the word and blendin your head or out loud. Can you get your c-oa-t?
	Segmenting Breaking words or parts of words into phonemes.	CEW Common exception words are words where the usual spelling rule doesn't apply.
